

Coomies Walk

This is a walk to four lookouts near Currarong offering great views over the Tasman Sea.

The walk starts at Abrahams Bosom east end car park. Cross over the wooden bridge



Footbridge crossing Bosom Creek (Abrahams Bosom Creek) and follow the track to the map junction (Map Board of Coomies Walk). Keep left and head north for 1km to the Merimbula ship wreck at Whale Point. The remains of the bow of the ship can be visited at low tide.

Leaving the wreck site, return to the last junction and keep left, following the shore along a track to Wilsons Beach



Wilson's Beach

- a great spot to swim, have morning tea and explore the rocky shore. In the middle of the beach there is track heading east to Lobster Bay.

There is a viewing seat here looking at Lobster Island and Lobster Bay.

Keep walking and follow signs to Mermaid's Inlet. About 1 km turn right at the Coomies Walk sign. Here the track climbs to a rock plateau following the signs and marked trail to Merimbula Trig - 1.5 kms.

Follow the signs and marks heading south then west and north over the Abraham's Bosom Creek board walk.

The track turns west and along the way there is an aboriginal rock shelter with a board explanation. Continue on the track to the Track junction, turn left and return to the car park.

Variations: This walk can be extended by many side trips and variations :-

1. At low tide from Bosoms Beach follow the shoreline, rock hopping to Whale Point.
2. At low tide from Wilson's to Lobster Bay, follow the shore line rock hopping
3. On the main track turn right at the Lobster Bay sign to visit Lobster Bay, following the shoreline to Little Beecroft Head then climb to the top of the cliff ridge and follow a rough track to Gosangs Tunnel, which can be crawled through to a cliff shelf. The shelf is a great place for lunch, whale-watching (in season), views of the ocean and wild life.

4. 50 metres past the Coomies track sign at Mermaids Inlet is a way into Little Mermaids Inlet, on the south side of the track and Mermaids Inlet.
5. 500 metres from the Mermaids turnoff of the Coomies walk, after heading S. and at the top of the climb, turn left 50 metres to a cliff lookout, return to Coomies track.

6. Travel east and visit Beecroft Head, a little further south is Eve's Ravine which is an easy, but steep climb down on a track to the base of the cliffs, where there is a walk along the ledge at the bottom and sometimes a seal colony can be seen.
7. Moore's Inlet can be visited on either the north or south side. The south side gives the better view of the coastline. The Drum and Drumsticks can be seen from this point.
